### ALABAMA'S UNIFIED JUDICIAL SYSTEM

The Judicial Article Implementation Act of 1975 (Act No. 1975-1205) revised the Alabama Court System and prescribed the pattern for its operation. The major changes included:

- Over four hundred trial courts were reorganized into a unified system;
- Judges were required to be attorneys, with the exception of probate judges;
- Uniform jurisdictions were established for all trial courts;
- Judges were prohibited from re-election or appointment after the age of seventy;
- Authority was granted to the Supreme Court of Alabama to adopt rules pertaining to the administration of courts as well as governing practice and procedure;
- Provisions for the adoption of the *Canons of Judicial Ethics*;
- Provisions for the flexible assignment of judges;
- A central judicial administration system was built into the Alabama Constitution;
- Provisions for a Judicial Compensation Commission; and
- The creation of the Judicial Inquiry Commission and the Court of the Judiciary.

Amendment 328 of the Alabama Constitution of 1901 further provided for the exclusive judicial power of the State to be vested in a Unified Judicial System, to become effective January 17, 1977. Today, the Supreme Court of Alabama, the Court of Criminal Appeals, the Court of Civil Appeals, and the Administrative Office of Courts all operate within a single location in Montgomery, Alabama.

The Alabama Constitution, in addition to providing for the appellate courts of the State, provides for a trial court of general jurisdiction, known as the circuit court; a trial court for limited jurisdiction known as the district court; a probate court; and such municipal courts as may be provided by law.


The State of Alabama is divided into 41 judicial circuits, numbered and composed of counties in the same region. Jury trials within the State of Alabama occur at the circuit court level.

There is an office of the circuit clerk in each of the sixty-seven counties and one in the Bessemer Division of Jefferson County. The duties of the circuit clerk include the filing, processing, and maintenance of all court records.

Sessions of the district court are required to be held in each county seat. Although the district court is considered to be a "court of record," transcripts or reports of the court proceedings are not required by law. All cases are tried without a jury. Any given municipality of the State of Alabama, if it elects to do so, holds its own court proceedings according to the limitations provided by law. If the municipal court is abolished by that governing body, jurisdiction is transferred to the appropriate district court.


The probate courts in each county of the State have original and general jurisdictions over very specific matters delineated by statute. While constitutionally a part of the Alabama Judicial System, the probate courts are not included in the system's budget and are administered locally by the respective probate judge. Funding is generated through the county governments or through fees generated in probate court.

### THE SUPREME COURT OF ALABAMA

The Supreme Court of Alabama, Alabama's court of last resort, is composed of a Chief Justice and eight Associate Justices. All members of the Court are elected in statewide elections to six-year terms. The Supreme Court has general supervisory authority over all courts in the State and power to review any judgment of these courts. In addition, the Supreme Court has the authority to make administrative rules and regulations to ensure the efficient and speedy administration of justice and to make and promulgate rules governing practice and procedure in all courts in the State.

To facilitate the decision-making process, the Supreme Court has traditionally been divided into two divisions with a panel of four associate justices each. The Chief Justice sits on both divisions. If the five members of a division disagree on the disposition of a particular case, the case must be submitted to the entire Court for resolution. The Court's internal rules require consideration by the full Court of petitions for certiorari review in capital cases in which the death penalty is imposed, cases declaring a statute unconstitutional, advisory opinions to the Governor or the Legislature, utility rate cases, cases overruling a previous decision of the Supreme Court, and petitions for certiorari review in instances where the Supreme Court is reversing a judgment of the

Court of Criminal Appeals or the Court of Civil Appeals. The Supreme Court disposed of a total of 1,029 cases during fiscal year 2021. Of that total, 356 of the cases were direct appeals and 414 were petitions for writ of certiorari. The Court considered 238 petitions for writ of mandamus, and 8 miscellaneous petitions. The Supreme Court transferred ("deflected"), pursuant to \$12-2-7(6), Code of Alabama 1975, 57 appeals to the Court of Civil Appeals.

#### THE ALABAMA APPELLATE MEDIATION PROGRAM

The Alabama Appellate Mediation Program was created to provide parties an alternative method of resolving their disputes early in the appellate process, thereby saving the parties time, expense, and uncertainty.

The creation of the program began in July of 2003, when the Supreme Court of Alabama adopted Rule 55, of the Alabama Rules of Appellate Procedure (ARAP). Rule 55, ARAP, provides that any direct appeal, within the jurisdiction of the Supreme Court of Alabama or the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals, which is civil in counsel, is eligible for appellate mediation.

### THE SUPREME COURT OF ALABAMA

In November of 2003, the Supreme Court of Alabama adopted the Alabama Rules of Appellate Mediation. The program began referring appeals to mediation in January of 2004.

After an initial screening phase, a case may be referred (ordered) to mediation. If referred, mediation is mandatory, but settlement is not. The program provides the parties an opportunity to discuss alternatives to the judgment entered by the trial court and possible ruling by the appellate court. Parties and their attorneys work throughout this process with the assistance of a trained mediator of their choosing.

Below is the statistical information for the program during the period October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. In this time period, 50% of all cases ordered to appellate mediation reached


full settlement. Of those, 49% were Supreme Court cases and 51% were Court of Civil Appeals cases.

Since the program's inception in January of 2004, the combined completed cases referred to Appellate Mediation from both the Supreme Court and the Court of Civil Appeals have an average annual settlement rate of 50% or higher.

**Chief Justice Tom Parker** was first elected to the Alabama Supreme Court in 2004 and was reelected in 2010 and in 2016. He was elected Chief Justice in 2018.

Chief Justice Parker previously served as the Deputy Administrative Director of Courts, where he served as General Counsel for the Alabama court system, advising trial court judges, and as the Director of the Alabama Judicial College, providing training for new judges and continuing legal education for all trial judges in Alabama. In that capacity, he also served as the Legal Adviser to the Chief Justice.

Chief Justice Parker graduated *cum laude* from Dartmouth College, in Hanover, New Hampshire, and received his Juris Doctorate from Vanderbilt University School of Law, in Nashville, Tennessee. He won a Rotary International Fellowship to study law at the University of São Paulo School of Law, in São Paulo, Brazil, where he was the first foreign student in Brazil's most prestigious law school.

Chief Justice Parker served in the Alabama Attorney General's Office under then Alabama Attorneys General Jeff Sessions and Bill Pryor. As an Assistant Attorney General, he handled death-penalty cases, criminal appeals, and constitutional litigation. Previously, he was a partner in Parker & Kotouc, P.C., a Montgomery law firm that handled many high-profile constitutional cases.

Chief Justice Parker was founding Executive Director of the Alabama Family Alliance (now the Alabama Policy Institute), a state organization associated with Dr. James Dobson and Focus on the Family.

Chief Justice Parker is a Montgomery native--the son of the late Tommy Parker and Gloria Parker Pennington, and the stepson of the late Harry L. Pennington of Huntsville. He was elected student-body president at Montgomery's Sidney Lanier High School and Speaker of the House of both the YMCA Youth Legislature and Boys' State.

Chief Justice Parker and his wife, the former Dottie James of Auburn, have been married for 38 years. Dottie served as Supervisor of the Alabama Governor's Mansion during the administration of Alabama Governor Fob James. They are members of Frazer Memorial United Methodist Church.



Associate Justice Michael F. Bolin was born in, and is a lifetime resident of, Jefferson County, Alabama. He attended elementary school in Birmingham, being accepted into the first magnet school for scholastic achievement. He then attended Homewood Junior High School, and graduated from Shades Valley High School in 1966 as a member of the National Honor Society. In 1970, he received his B.S. in Business Administration from Samford University. In 1973, he received his J.D. from Cumberland School of Law, graduating cum laude. At Cumberland, he was on the Dean's List and served as Associate Editor of the Cumberland-Samford Law Review. He was later inducted into Curia Honors, Cumberland's leadership and honor society.

Justice Bolin was a practicing attorney in Birmingham from 1973 through 1988, when he was elected as Probate Judge of Jefferson County. He was re-elected to that position in 1994 and 2000. He served in that position until his election to the Alabama Supreme Court in 2004, and began serving as an Associate Justice in January 2005.

Justice Bolin was active in the Alabama Probate Judges Association, serving as chairman of various association committees. He was elected by his peers as President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Probate Judges Association. He served on the Children's Code Committee, Probate Procedures Committee, Adoption Committee, and Paternity Committee of the Alabama Law Institute. He authored the Putative Father Registry law in Alabama, which protects the rights of all parties in adoption proceedings. He received the national award from the "Angels of Adoption" organization in Washington, D.C. in 2000 for his service to adoptive families. He additionally served as Chief Election Official, Chairman of the Alabama Electronic Voting Committee, and as Vice Chairman of the Governor's Commission on Consolidation, Efficiency, and Funding in 2003. He is a member of the Vestavia-Hoover Kiwanis Club.

Justice Bolin and his wife, Rosemary, have one daughter, Leigh Anne. They attend St. Peter the Apostle Church in Hoover.



Associate Justice James Gregory "Greg" Shaw was born in 1957 and raised in Birmingham, where he graduated from Banks High School. Justice Shaw graduated from Auburn University in 1979, receiving a B.S. degree with a major in Chemistry. He is married to S. Samantha "Sam" Shaw. Justice Shaw met Sam while at Auburn, and they married in August 1980, just before Justice Shaw's second year of law school. Sam was elected Alabama's State Auditor in 2006 and reelected in 2010.

In 1982, Justice Shaw graduated in the top 10% of his class from Samford University's Cumberland School of Law. While at Cumberland, he received the American Jurisprudence Award for excellence in the study of evidence under Professor Charles Gamble, the author of the preeminent evidence treatise in Alabama.

After his admission to the Alabama State Bar in 1982, Justice Shaw worked with a small law firm in St. Clair County. He later started his own general law practice in Birmingham. In the fall of 1984, Justice Shaw joined the staff of Supreme Court Associate Justice Janie L. Shores and moved

to Montgomery. After serving as Justice Shores' staff attorney for one year, he joined the staff of Supreme Court Associate Justice James Gorman Houston, Jr., in the fall of 1985, where he served as Justice Houston's senior staff attorney for over 15 years. Justice Shaw was elected to the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals in 2000 and was reelected to the Court in 2006. On March 16, 2007, Justice Shaw was appointed Chief Judge of the Alabama Court of the Judiciary. Justice Shaw served on both the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals and the Alabama Court of the Judiciary until January 20, 2009, when, after being elected in 2008, he assumed the office of Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of Alabama. He was reelected to the Supreme Court in 2014 and 2020.

Justice Shaw completed the Master of Laws Program at the University of Virginia School of Law in 2004, receiving the degree of Master of Laws (LL.M.) in the Judicial Process. He graduated with 30 other state and federal judges selected nationwide and he is one of only 3 judges from Alabama to participate in the program. Justice Shaw is an Honorary Master of the Bench of the Hugh Maddox Inn of Court in Montgomery and has served on the Alabama State Bar's Committee on Archives and History. Justice Shaw also serves as the Supreme Court's liaison on the Standing Committee of the Rules of Evidence.

Justice and Mrs. Shaw have two sons. Gregory graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point in 2007 with a degree in mechanical engineering. He is married to Dr. Elise Shaw. Christopher, "CJ," graduated in May 2009 from Georgia Tech with an honors degree in mechanical engineering. He is married to Dr. Nicole Shaw. Justice and Mrs. Shaw are members of Auburn United Methodist Church.



Associate Justice Alisa Kelli Wise, a graduate of Prattville High School, received a B.S. in Biology, with a minor in Nursing, from Auburn University and a Juris Doctorate from Jones School of Law. She later earned a Master of Public Administration from Auburn University Montgomery where Justice Wise was the recipient of the 2005 Outstanding Graduate Award by the AUM Department of Political Science and Public Administration. Recently, Justice Wise was honored to be named as one of AUM's Top 40 Graduates during the University's 40th Anniversary Celebration.

During her legal career, Justice Wise worked in the Governor's Legislative Office, served as legal counsel for ProStaff HRM, Inc., and was associated with the law firms of John Taber & Associates and Pittman, Pittman, Carwie & Fuquay. Prior to her election to the bench, she served as a staff attorney on the Court of Criminal Appeals and the Alabama Supreme Court. Justice Wise was first elected to the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals in 2000 becoming the youngest woman ever elected to sit on an Alabama Appellate Court. She was re-elected in 2006 and was later selected to serve as Presiding Judge of the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals. Justice Wise was

elected to the Supreme Court of Alabama in 2010.

Committed to helping at-risk children, Justice Wise was appointed by Governor Bob Riley to serve on the Alabama Council on Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention in 2003 and reappointed in 2006. Judge Wise currently serves on the Alabama Law Institute Criminal Code Committee tasked with helping to re-write the Alabama Criminal Code and the Advisory Committee on Criminal Procedure. In addition, Judge Wise serves on the board of directors for the Family Sunshine Center, Distinguished Young Woman of Alabama, Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts, Hands On River Region, Junior League of Montgomery and Max Credit Union.

Justice Wise and her husband, former Montgomery County District Court Judge Arthur Ray, are the proud parents of Hanah-Mathis, a sophomore at St. James School. They are active members of St. James United Methodist Church.



Associate Justice Tommy Elias Bryan was raised on a family farm in Crenshaw County, Alabama, where his parents taught him the values of faith, family, and hard work. He is the son of Margie Spivey Bryan and the late Elias Daniel Bryan.

A 1974 graduate of Brantley High School, Justice Bryan continued his education at Troy State University, where he received Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in education. In 1983, he graduated from Jones School of Law. After graduating from law school, Justice Bryan served as a staff attorney for the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals.

In 1987, Justice Bryan became an assistant attorney general for the State of Alabama, serving as an associate general counsel for Alabama's environmental department. In this position he gained valuable experience in defending and interpreting highly technical and scientific regulations and standards, as well as drafting administrative orders and reviewing legislation pertaining to environmental issues.

In 2004, Justice Bryan successfully campaigned for a seat on the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals and was sworn into office as a Judge on that court in January 2005. Justice Bryan was victorious in his own reelection effort to the Court of Civil Appeals in November 2010. In 2012, Justice Bryan was elected to the Alabama Supreme Court. Also, in 2012, Justice Bryan was named "Judge of the Year" by the Family Law Section of the Alabama State Bar.

Justice Bryan is a member of the Alabama Bar Association, where he serves as a member of the Environmental Law and Appellate Practice Sections, and he has served as vice chairman of the Quality of Life Committee. He is also a member of the Montgomery County Bar Association. He has been admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court and the United States Courts of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit and the District of Columbia.

Justice Bryan is married to the former Pamela Mizzell from Tuscaloosa, and they have two children, a daughter, Thomason, and a son, Tucker. The Bryan family attends Montgomery's First Baptist Church. Justice Bryan is a Deacon there and sings in the sanctuary choir. He also teaches a young-married-adult Sunday School class.



**Associate Justice William B. Sellers** was appointed by Governor Kay Ivey in May 2017 to fill a vacancy on the Supreme Court of Alabama.

Justice Sellers received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Hillsdale College in 1985, a Juris Doctorate from the University of Alabama in 1988, and a Masters of Laws in Taxation from New York University in 1989. Justice Sellers practiced law in Montgomery for 28 years. He maintained a general business practice with emphasis on taxation, business organizations and finance. A major part of Justice Sellers's practice involved tax litigation.

Justice Sellers is a member of numerous civic organizations and professional associations. In 2012, he received the President's Award for service to the Alabama Bar Association. In 2013, Governor Robert Bentley appointed Justice Sellers to the Alabama State Council on the Arts. In August 2014, Justice Sellers was elected chairman of the Fair Ballot Commission. He is past president of the Rotary Club of Montgomery, past chairman of the Montgomery Area Business Committee for the

Arts, chairman of the River Region United Way Campaign in 2008, and past chairman of the YMCA of Greater Montgomery. Justice Sellers was a member of the Electoral College in 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2016.

Justice Sellers is admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court, the Supreme Court of Alabama, the District of Columbia Court of Appeals, the United States District Courts for the Middle and Northern Districts of Alabama, the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, and the United States Tax Court. He is a member of the Alabama State Bar, the Montgomery County Bar Association, and the District of Columbia Bar. Since 2014, he has served as the community liaison with the International Officers School at Maxwell Air Force Base.

Justice Sellers and his wife, Lee, have been married for 33 years. They are members of Trinity Presbyterian Church and have three adult children.

Associate Justice Brady E. (Brad) Mendheim, Jr., was appointed to the Alabama Supreme Court on January 22, 2018, by Governor Kay Ivey to fill a vacancy created by the retirement of Associate Justice Glenn Murdock. Before his appointment, Justice Mendheim served as a circuit judge for the 20th Judicial Circuit (Henry and Houston Counties), a position he had held since 2009. From 2001 until 2009, Justice Mendheim served as a district judge in Houston County. From 2001 until his appointment as an Associate Justice, he was appointed specially by various Chief Justices to preside over more than 250 cases in more than 40 Alabama counties.

As a district and circuit judge, Justice Mendheim was a long-time faculty member of the Alabama Judicial College and an active member of the Circuit Judges Education Committee. Justice Mendheim has served on the Supreme Court's Advisory Committee on the Rules of Civil Procedure, the Statewide Committee on Drug Courts, the Chief Justice's Judicial Reallocation Task Force, and the Weighted Caseload Committee.

Before becoming a judge in 2001, Justice Mendheim was an assistant district attorney for the 20th Judicial Circuit for almost seven years.

During that time he served on the board of directors of the Southeast Alabama Child Advocacy Center. Before becoming an assistant district attorney, he worked with a general-practice law firm in Dothan with a focus on defense in civil litigation.

Justice Mendheim attended Dothan city schools, graduating from Northview High School. He graduated from Auburn University with high honors and from Samford University's Cumberland School of Law in 1993. In law school, he was a member of the law review American Journal of Trial Advocacy and also served as a legal-research and writing instructor to first-year law students.

Justice Mendheim's parents are the late Brady and Nancy Mendheim. Justice Mendheim and his wife, Michelle, who is from Piedmont, Alabama, have been married for more than 25 years, and they have 3 sons. Justice Mendheim and his family are longtime members of First Baptist Church of Dothan, where he serves as a Sunday school teacher, deacon, and church trustee.



Associate Justice Sarah Stewart, a long-time resident of Mobile, was elected to the Supreme Court of Alabama in November 2018. She is the daughter of Reginald and Suzanne Hicks. Her only brother, Charlie Hicks, was an attorney in Mobile until his untimely death in 2014. Justice Stewart and her family lived all over the world for the majority of her childhood while her father worked as a petroleum geologist.

In 1981, Justice Stewart graduated from Union High School in Tulsa, Oklahoma; she earned a Bachelor of Arts and a Master of Arts in Communication at the University of Arkansas in 1985 and 1986. While in college, she was a member of Kappa Alpha Theta, Mortar Board, Omicron Delta Kappa, and Order of Omega and served as president of the Student Government Association her senior year. In 1992, Justice Stewart earned her J.D. from Vanderbilt Law School where she was vice president of the Law Student Association.

After graduating from Vanderbilt, Justice Stewart practiced law with Hand Arendall LLC, Ezell & Sharbrough LLC, and finally with her

brother, Charlie. As a lawyer, Justice Stewart was the first female president of the Mobile Young Lawyers and served on many local and state bar committees. Justice Stewart was appointed a circuit judge in the 13th Judicial Circuit by Governor Riley in 2006 and ran for the position three times unopposed. As a circuit judge, Justice Stewart handled thousands of civil and criminal cases, ranging from simple car wrecks to multi-million dollar business disputes and from possession of marijuana to capital murder. During her 13 years as a circuit judge, Justice Stewart served as the co-chair on Professionalism in the Bench and Bar, on the Supreme Court's standing committee on the Alabama Rules of Evidence, and on many other Alabama State Bar and judicial committees. Justice Stewart was active in the leadership of the Circuit Judges Association, serving as Education Chair for eight years and was elected by her fellow judges in July 2018 as the first female president of the Circuit Judges Association.

**Associate Justice James L. "Jay" Mitchell** was elected to the Alabama Supreme Court in 2018.

Prior to serving on the Supreme Court, Justice Mitchell was an accomplished litigation attorney with Maynard, Cooper & Gale, P.C. During his time in private practice, he tried a number of complex cases to verdict, successfully handled appeals, and obtained favorable settlements for clients. He was rated as one of the top litigators in the United States and Alabama, and received the highest possible rating for professional ethics. He also served on Maynard, Cooper & Gale's executive committee, helping to lead strategic and growth initiatives for the firm.

Justice Mitchell was born in Mobile and grew up in South Alabama and in Homewood. Julia Jordan Weller, a native of Montgomery, Alabama, attended Hollins University and obtained her undergraduate degree from the University of Alabama in 1985. The Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals is a five-judge court having exclusive appellate jurisdiction of all criminal cases, including all post-conviction writs arising therefrom. The Court has authority to issue remedial writs necessary to give it general superintendence and control over all trial courts exercising jurisdiction in criminal proceedings. Judgments of the Court of Criminal Appeals are subject to discretionary review by the Supreme Court of Alabama.

#### **FILINGS**

During the 2020-2021 Term, the Court of Criminal Appeals had a total caseload of 1,649 cases, of which 1,016 were new filings. The 1,016 new filings in the 2020-2021 Term represent a 11.88% decrease in filings from the preceding term, and a 25.13% decrease in filings from the number of filings five years earlier. This signifi-

cant decrease is attributable to the COVID-19 pandemic. During the Court Term, many circuit courts suspended with or had minimal jury trials due to the continuing pandemic. The filing of notices of appeal to this Court has been directly impacted by the trial courts' inability to resolve criminal matters during the COVID-19 pandemic.

According to the most recent data maintained by the National Center for State Courts, the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals ranks fourth among all intermediate courts of appeals and eleventh among all appellate courts in the nation as to the number of cases filed per judge. For the 2020-2021 Term, there were an average of 203 filings per judge.

### ALABAMA COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS

#### **DISPOSITIONS**

In the 2020-2021 Term, the Court of Criminal Appeals disposed of 1,134 cases – 776 appeals and 358 petitions. The Court's throughput for the 2020-2021 Term was 111.6%, causing the Court to begin the 2021-2022 Term with 118 less cases than were pending at the start of the 2020-2021 Term. (See Table 3 for an analysis of the dispositions.)

#### **DECISIONS**

The Court of Criminals Appeals issued 592 decisions in submitted appeals during the 2020-Of these decisions, trial court judg-2021 Term. ments were affirmed in 450 appeals; trial court judgments were reversed and the causes were remanded in 29 appeals; 44 appeals were dismissed; 62 appeals were remanded to the trial courts with instructions; 5 appeals were affirmed in part and reversed in part; and 2 appeal was transferred to another court. Written opinions were released in 74 appeals. Memorandum decisions were released in 426 appeals. The Court issued 92 orders in submitted cases. Of those 92 orders, 42 orders were dispositive in nature, 48 orders remanded the matter to the trial court with instructions, and 2 orders transferred the appeal to another court. Out of the 364 original petitions that were disposed of in the 2020-2021 Term, 7 petitions (1.92% of the total) were granted by the Court.

#### TIME STANDARDS

In 1989, the Supreme Court, by order, set a 280-day time standards goal that ran from notice of appeal or the filing of a petition to the initial decision. In April 1995, the original goal was modified to conform to the Times Standards Reference Models recommended by the American Bar Association. The current goal is to issue rulings in 75% of all cases within 290 days from their start, and 95% of all cases within 365 days. In the 2020-2021 Term, 83% of all initial decisions by the Court of Criminal Appeals were released within the 290 days, thus surpassing the 75% goal for the 290-day period by 8%, and 90% were released within 365 days. In the 2020-2021 Term, the average time

from start to the initial decision in all cases decreased by 2 days, from 165 days in the 2019-2020 Term to 163 days in the 2020-2021 Term. The average time from start to the initial decision in submitted cases increased by 3 days, from 266 days during the 2019-2020 Term to 269 days during the 2020-2021 Term. (See Table 4 for five-year summary of Court's Time Standards Performance.)



Presiding Judge Mary Becker Windom was elected to the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals in 2008, and became the Court's Presiding Judge in 2012 and was reelected to the Court in 2014 and 2020.

Judge Windom was born in Mobile and was raised in Bay Minette in a family dedicated to public service. Her late mother, Ina Becker, was the former Tax Assessor of Baldwin County. Her late father, Earl V. Becker, was a rural mail carrier for more than 40 years. Judge Windom attended public schools in Bay Minette, graduating from Baldwin County High School in 1977 in the top of her class. In 1982, she earned her bachelor's degree from the University of South Alabama.

Following her graduation, Judge Windom worked to help build the local economy, working for two Chambers of Commerce. She served as Executive Director of the Bay Minette Chamber of Commerce, then as Director of Membership for the Mobile Area Chamber of Commerce.

Ultimately, she decided to return to school to earn her law degree. She graduated magna cum

laude from the Thomas Goode Jones School of Law at Faulkner University in Montgomery in 1999. While in law school, she served on the Board of Editors of the Jones Law Review.

Judge Windom began her legal career in private practice and later became an Assistant United States Attorney in the Southern District of Alabama. Immediately prior to joining the Court of Criminal Appeals, she served as a Deputy Attorney General for the State of Alabama.

She is a member of the Mobile and Montgomery Bar Associations. She is admitted to practice in the United States District Court for the Southern District of Alabama, in the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, and in the Supreme Court of the United States. She presently serves on the Alabama Supreme Court Advisory Committee on the Rules of Criminal Procedure. She has also served on the Chief Justice's Commission on Professionalism and the Judicial Study Commission Sub-Committee on Indigent Defense. Additionally, Judge Windom has served as a Special Justice for the Alabama Supreme Court.

Judge Windom has served the communities in which she has lived by serving on the Board of Directors of Junior Achievement of Mobile, the National Board of Distinguished Young Women, the Board of Directors of the Montgomery Humane Society, and the Board of Directors of Alabama Children First. She is a current member of the Children's Harbor Anchor Society.

She is married to Steve Windom, who served in the Alabama State Senate from 1989-98. He also served as Lieutenant Governor from 1999-2003. They have two sons, Robert and Thomas. Both are attorneys: Robert is legal counsel at Apple, Inc., in Los Angeles, and Thomas is an Assistant United States Attorney in Maryland. They have three granddaughters and one grandson.

The Windoms are members of the Church of Christ.



Judge J. Elizabeth "Beth" Kellum grew up in the Tuscaloosa County town of Vance. She is the daughter of Peggy and Milton Kellum and has one brother, Brian Kellum. Growing up, Beth and her family were members of Vance Baptist Church. Beth is a product of Alabama's public-school system, graduating from Brookwood High School in 1977. Beth was her high school's representative to Alabama Girls State; she was also named a National Merit Scholar, receiving a four-year scholarship which she used to attend the University of Alabama.

Judge Kellum received both her undergraduate and law degrees from the University of Alabama--a B.A. cum laude in May 1981, and a J.D. in May 1984. As an undergraduate, she majored in political science and minored in history; she was a Dean's List student and was also elected to Phi Beta Kappa. As a result of her interest in government and public service, she worked as a congressional intern in Washington, D.C. in 1978, interning for her Congressman, Walter Flowers--then the representative from Alabama's Seventh District. In law school she was active in numerous activities, including the SBA Senate, Law Week, and Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity; she also clerked part-time for a local circuit judge. She was awarded the American Jurisprudence prize for Securities Regulation in 1983, and the American Jurisprudence prize for Labor Law in 1984.

Although interested in many aspects of the law, Judge Kellum was particularly drawn to public service. After completing a judicial clerkship, she was hired in 1985 by Attorney General Charles Graddick as an Assistant Attorney General. She worked in the criminal appeals division where she primarily prosecuted appeals before the Court of Criminal Appeals and the Alabama Supreme Court; however, she also handled cases in the United States District Court for the Northern, Middle, and Southern Districts of Alabama and the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit. Her work as an Assistant Attorney General led to an offer to become a Staff Attorney for the Court of Criminal Appeals from 1987 until 1990.

Judge Kellum then went into private practice with the Montgomery law firm of Robison & Belser, P.A., working on a wide variety of civil and criminal cases in state and federal courts that dealt with diverse and complex legal issues. While Judge Kellum enjoyed private practice and the challenging cases she worked on, she realized that she had never lost her desire for public service--a desire that led her back to the Court of Criminal Appeals in 1997 to work as a Senior Staff Attorney for the newly-elected Judge Jean Brown. She worked as a Senior Staff Attorney for the Alabama Supreme Court from 1999 until 2001, before returning to the Court of Criminal Appeals as the Senior Staff Attorney for then newly-elected Judge Kelli Wise. After working with appellate judges on a day-today basis, she qualified as a candidate for the Court of Criminal Appeals and was elected to the Court in November 2008.

Judge Kellum is a member of the First Baptist Church of Montgomery. She has served as a docent at the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts, and is a member of a number of professional, civic, and political organizations--including the Montgomery County Bar Association, Farrah Law Alumni Society, Alabama Bench and Bar Historical Society, League of Women Voters, Federalist Society, Landmarks Foundation of Montgomery, and various Republican organizations. Her hobbies include reading, bridge, traveling, genealogy, and music.



Judge J. Chris McCool, a lifelong resident of Pickens County, Alabama, grew up on the family farm near Gordo, Alabama, in the Zion Community. He is the oldest son of Harold and Diane McCool, also of the Zion Community. Judge McCool grew up working on the farm that has been in his family for five generations, and which he now manages for his parents.

In 1985, Judge McCool graduated from Pickens Academy as valedictorian. He earned a Bachelor of Arts degree *summa cum laude* from the University of Alabama in 1990, with a double major in History and Classics. In 1990, he received the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Award for outstanding senior man at the University of Alabama. He also served in the Student Government Association as a member of the Student Senate, and as Chief Justice of the Student Court during his undergraduate tenure.

Judge McCool graduated from the University of Alabama School of Law in 1993, where he served as an Associate Justice and ultimately as Chief Justice of the Honor Court. He was a member of the Alabama Law Review.

Immediately after graduation, Judge McCool returned to his hometown of Gordo to practice law with local attorney C.O. Burkhalter. In 1995, he was appointed to serve as the first ever full-time Assistant District Attorney for Pickens County, and in 2001 he was appointed District Attorney for the 24th Judicial Circuit, comprised of Fayette, Lamar, and Pickens Counties.

During his career in public service, Judge McCool served in various leadership roles, serving on the Executive Committee of the Alabama District Attorneys Association ("the ADAA") for 10 years and as its president, vice president, and treasurer during that time. In 2007, he was named "Prosecutor of the Year" by VOCAL (Victims of Crime and Leniency) and "District Attorney of the Year" by the ADAA. He was also named "Prosecutor of the Year" by the Alabama Forest Owners Association in 2012. Since 2010, he has served as a member of the Alabama Supreme Court's Standing Committee on the Alabama Rules of Evidence, and he was a longstanding member of the Northern District U.S. Attorney's Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee.

Both in private practice and as a prosecutor, Judge McCool handled thousands of felony cases and tried dozens of jury trials, ranging from misdemeanor appeals to capital murder cases. He was instrumental in bringing a Drug Court to the 24th Judicial Circuit. Judge McCool served as a municipal court judge for the municipalities of Reform and Pickensville, as well as an adjunct professor in the Trial Advocacy Program at the University of Alabama School of Law from 1998 to 2000.

Judge McCool and his wife, Sherri, live about ten miles north of Gordo, Alabama, in the Zion Community. They have four children and a son-in-law, all of whom are members of Zion Primitive Baptist Church, which Judge McCool pastors. He has lived on the same dirt road all his life and has been blessed to raise his children on the family farm.



Judge J. William "Bill" Cole was born and raised in Birmingham, Alabama. He is the son of the late Judge William H. Cole and Sally Grant Cole. After graduating from high school, he attended Vanderbilt University. He graduated from Vanderbilt in 1989 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in English and Political Science. He then attended the University of Alabama School of Law and received his law degree in 1992.

After law school, Judge Cole returned to Birmingham and began practicing law with a firm that eventually became Luker, Cole & Associates. He represented clients throughout the State of Alabama in cases including civil, criminal, domestic relations, family court and probate court. In his 13 years of practicing law, Judge Cole focused on criminal cases in state, federal, municipal, and appellate courts. His appellate practice included representing clients in the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals, the Supreme Court of Alabama, the United States Court of Appeals for the Eleventh Circuit, and the United States Supreme Court. While a practicing attorney, Judge Cole served as a special prosecutor and a special circuit court judge. He also served as a municipal court judge in Morris, Alabama, for approximately 4 years.

In 2005, Judge Cole was appointed by Governor Bob Riley to serve as a Jefferson County Circuit Judge. He was subsequently elected twice by the citizens of Jefferson County to serve six-year terms as a judge in the Criminal Division. In this capacity as a circuit court judge, he presided over thousands of criminal cases and more than 175 felony jury trials.

Judge Cole is a member of the Birmingham Bar Association, the Alabama Bar Association, and the American Bar Association. He has served for years as a member of the Advisory Council to the Alabama Sentencing Commission and has represented the Alabama Circuit Judges Association on the Victim Notification Implementation Task Force. He is also a member of the Kiwanis Club of Birmingham and is active in many clubs and organizations.

In November 2018, Judge Cole was elected to serve a six-year term on the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals.

Bill Cole has been married to Kelli Clayton Cole for over 26 years. They have 4 children ages 27, 22, 19 (twins). He is active in the community and coached little league baseball and soccer for over 10 years. The Coles are members of Canterbury United Methodist Church, where Kelli and Bill served as youth Sunday school teachers for 12 years.



Judge Richard J. Minor was elected to the Alabama Court of Criminal Appeals on November 6, 2018. Prior to his election, Judge Minor was the District Attorney for St. Clair County. He is the son of Larry and Pam Minor of Pell City, Alabama. His twin brother is a District Court Judge in St. Clair County.

Judge Minor graduated from Auburn University in 1990 (B.A. in Criminal Justice, *summa cum laude*) and from Cumberland School of Law at Samford University in 1993. During law school, Judge Minor was a member of the American Journal of Trial Advocacy, served as a Cordell Hull Teaching Fellow for first-year law students, and was a Samford Senator.

Judge Minor began his career as a public servant, serving first as an Assistant District Attorney in both Tuscaloosa County and Jefferson County and then as an Assistant Attorney General in the Criminal Trials and Violent Crimes Divisions under Alabama Attorneys General Jeff Sessions and Bill Pryor, Jr. Judge Minor served as the Chief Trial Attorney in the St. Clair County District Attorney's Office before being elected District Attorney in 2004. In 2006, he was appointed as a

Special Prosecutor and Acting Attorney General for the State of Alabama overseeing the State of Alabama's interest in a joint federal and state investigation of public corruption in the Post-Secondary System of Alabama.

As District Attorney, Judge Minor was a founding member of the St. Clair County Community Corrections and Punishment Authority, which helped establish a Community Corrections program, an Adult Drug Court, a Veterans Court, and a Mental Health Court. He was an active member of the Alabama District Attorneys Association where he was elected by his peers as President, Vice President, and Secretary/Treasurer of the association.

Judge Minor currently serves as Chairman of the State of Alabama Advisory Committee on Criminal Procedure. He has also served on the Governor's Advisory Council on Juvenile Justice, the Governor's Juvenile Crime Enforcement Coalition, the Alabama Sentencing Commission Standards Committee, the Alabama Pattern Jury Instructions (Criminal) Committee, the Review Committee for Alabama's Protocol for the Examination and Treatment of Sexual Assaults, and the Executive Committee of the Alabama Republican Party representing St. Clair County. He is a member of the Federalist Society for Law and Public Policy Studies. Judge Minor believes it is the duty of the judiciary to say what the law is, not what it should he.

Judge Minor is a member of the St. Clair County and Alabama Bar Associations. He is admitted to practice in the Northern District Court of Alabama and in the Supreme Court of the United States. He is an alumnus of the National College of District Attorneys, the National Advocacy Center, and Leadership Alabama.

Judge Minor is married to the former Angela Callahan of Pell City, Alabama. They have three children. The Minors are active members of Church of the Highlands.

### CLERK OF THE ALABAMA COURT OF CRIMINAL APPEALS



On June 26, 2012 Scott Mitchell was appointed Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals of Alabama, effective August 1, 2012. He is the fourth individual to serve as Clerk of the Court since its establishment in 1969.

A native of Wilcox County, he is the son of Curtis and Bonnie Mitchell. He received his early education at Wilcox Academy in Camden. In 1999, he received the Bachelor of Science degree in business administration and history from Erskine College in Due West, South Carolina. While a student at Erskine, he served as senior class president. Mr. Mitchell received his Juris Doctor from the University of Alabama in 2002.

Upon graduation from law school, Mr. Mitchell entered private practice with the Montgomery law firm of Beers, Anderson, Jackson, Hughes, and Patty, P.C. In 2006, he became a staff attorney for the Court of Criminal Appeals. From 2007 until 2009, he served as a staff attorney for

Chief Justice Sue Bell Cobb. He also served as Chief of Staff and Legislative Liaison for the chief justice from 2009 until 2011. From 2011 until his appointment as Clerk of the Court of Criminal Appeals, Mr. Mitchell served as a staff attorney with the Alabama Administrative Office of Courts.

Mr. Mitchell served on the Board of Trustees of his alma mater, Erskine College, from 2005 until 2011. he Court of Civil Appeals, composed of a pre-L siding judge and four associate judges, was created by the Alabama Legislature in 1969. The Court has original appellate jurisdiction in all civil appeals where the amount in controversy does not exceed \$50,000; in all appeals from administrative agencies, other than the Alabama Public Service Commission; in all appeals in workers' compensation cases; in all appeals in domestic relation cases, including annulment, divorce, adoption, and child custody; and in statutory cases, including Students First Act and SHPDA, among others. The Supreme Court may also transfer cases filed in that court to the Court of Civil Appeals for disposition. All decisions of the Court are made en banc. Each judge is required to review each case submitted to the Court.

For TY 2021, the Court of Civil Appeals reported a total caseload of 1,603 cases. This figure includes 1,058 new filings and 545 cases that, at the close of the previous term, were not ready for submission, were on rehearing, or were on review to the Supreme Court of Alabama.

The Court of Civil Appeals disposed of 1,045 cases. Of this number, 181 cases or 17.32% were decided with written opinions.

Case filings in TY 2021 increased by .37% from TY 2020. For the five-year period, TY 2017 through TY 2021, filings increased by 14.50%.

The total caseload of the court increased by 3.69% from the previous year. During TY 2021 the court disposed of 1,045 cases: 181 were decided with opinion; 375 were affirmed without opinion; 59 were either dismissed, or writs were granted or denied; and 430 were disposed before submission. The average time from notice of appeal to written decision was 225 days, compared to 228 days for TY 2020.

Of the 615 cases disposed by opinion, summary affirmance, and other reasons, the Court affirmed the judgment of 66.83%; reversed the judgment in 7.64%; in 2.76% of the cases, the judgment was affirmed in part and reversed in part; and, 22. 77% were disposed by dismissal or other reason.

#### APPLICATIONS FOR REHEARING

An application for rehearing is the method by which one, or both, of the parties requests the court to reconsider its earlier decision in a case. Of the cases that were disposed by submission and decision, 110 applications for rehearing were filed. Approximately 82.11 % of the cases on rehearing had no change.

### ALABAMA COURT OF CIVIL APPEALS

### REVIEW BY THE SUPREME COURT OF ALABAMA

The Supreme Court of Alabama ruled on 127 petitions for certiorari from the Court of Civil Appeals during TY 2021. Approximately 95.45% of those decisions were upheld by the Supreme Court.




Presiding Judge William Cooper Thompson was born in January 1962. Judge Thompson grew up in Autauga and Elmore Counties. He attended the University of Alabama, where he completed his Bachelor of Arts degree in 1984. He graduated from the Cumberland School of Law at Samford University with a Juris Doctor degree in 1988.

Judge Thompson, a resident of Homewood, was elected to the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals in 1996 and was re-elected to the court in 2002, 2008, 2014 and 2020. He became presiding judge of the court in 2007. Prior to serving as an appellate judge, Judge Thompson practiced law in both Birmingham and Montgomery, including serving as assistant legal advisor to the Governor of Alabama and working in the law firm of former Chief Justice Perry O. Hooper, Sr.

Judge Thompson serves on the executive committee of the Judicial Inquiry Commission and is a member of the Legislative Coordinating Conference and the Advisory Committee on Child Support Guidelines. He has served on the Chief Justice's Commission on Professionalism, the Appellate Rules Committee, the Judicial Study Commission, the Alabama Court Improvement Project, the Alabama Juvenile Code Revision Committee, and the Committee on the Future of the Juvenile Justice System. Judge Thompson was the Chief Judge of the Alabama Court of the Judiciary for ten years. He is a member of the Kiwanis Club of Birmingham, a former member of the advisory board of the Service Guild of Birmingham's Early Intervention Program, and a former member of the board of directors of Children First.

Judge Thompson is married to author Melinda Rainey Thompson formerly of Greenville, Alabama, and they have three children. The family attends St. Stephen's Episcopal Church.



Judge Terry A. Moore is a 1990 graduate of the University of South Alabama. He graduated magna cum laude from the University of Alabama School of Law in 1993. Following graduation, he entered private practice in the Mobile, Alabama, office of Adams & Reese where he specialized in workers' compensation and civil litigation. In 1998, he became a partner in the Mobile law firm of Vickers, Riis, Murray & Curran, LLC. In 2004, Moore co-founded Austill, Lewis, Pipkin & Moore, P.C., where he served as a member until his election to the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals in 2006.

While practicing law, Moore published numerous articles in legal journals, law reviews, and seminars. In 1998, West Publishing issued Alabama Workers' Compensation, a two-volume treatise that was written by Moore between 1992 and 1997. That treatise is now considered the leading authority on its subject by the appellate courts of Alabama, having been cited in dozens of cases. Moore has used the knowledge he gained from researching this book to teach workers' com-

pensation law to judges, lawyers, and workers' compensation professionals throughout the State and to provide *pro bono* services.

Judge Moore's greatest accomplishments have been his marriage and the birth of his two sons. He married the former Ashlee Stewart of Mobile in 1992. In 1999, they welcomed Michael Alexander "Alex" Moore to the family and in 2003 the family was completed with the birth of Thomas "Pierce" Moore.



**Judge Christy Olinger Edwards** grew up on a small family farm in West Alabama. She was elected to the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals in November 2018.

Judge Edwards is a 2004 graduate of the University of Alabama's Culverhouse College of Business, where she studied Finance and Economics, and is a 2008 graduate of Faulkner University's Thomas Goode Jones School of Law. In 2014, she graduated *cum laude* from the University of Alabama School of Law with an LL.M. in Taxation.

Judge Edwards has served the people of Alabama for most of her legal career. In September 2016, she was appointed by the Governor as an associate judge of the Alabama Tax Tribunal. Before serving as a judge on the tax tribunal, she was an assistant attorney general and served as legal and policy advisor to the commissioners of the Alabama Department of Revenue. Before joining the Department, she served as an attorney for the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals.

Judge Edwards is the youngest statewideelected official who is currently serving, and is the youngest female ever elected to an Alabama appellate court.

Judge Edwards has had articles published in national journals regarding taxation, and she has traveled the state and country speaking about state and local taxation. She is a member of the committee on the Alabama Rules of Professional Conduct and of the committee on the Alabama Canons of Judicial Ethics.

Judge Chad Arthur Hanson earned his Juris Doctor in 2000 from Mississippi College School of Law. He received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Political Science from the University of Alabama in 1997. Following law school, Judge Hanson entered private practice for 18 years, where he represented thousands of individuals and businesses throughout the State of Alabama primarily in civil and bankruptcy litigation until his election to the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals in November 2018.

Judge Hanson resides in Trussville and is married to the former Joy Gentry of Midfield. They are proud parents of two daughters, Reagan and Riley.

### JUDGES OF THE ALABAMA COURT OF CIVIL APPEALS



Judge Matt Fridy was elected to the Alabama Court of Civil Appeals in 2020. Born in Virginia, he grew up in the Birmingham area, attending high school at what is now known as the Jefferson County International Baccalaureate School. He graduated with honors from the University of Montevallo with a degree in History. He earned his law degree, magna cum laude, from Samford University's Cumberland School of Law, where he served as Executive Editor of the Cumberland Law Review and was inducted into Curia Honoris.

After law school, Judge Fridy served a oneyear federal clerkship for U.S. District Judge Edwin Nelson. He then joined a Birmingham law firm, where his law practice focused on constitutional law, appellate litigation, and agricultural law. ### SUPREME COURT AND STATE LAW LIBRARY

The Alabama Supreme Court and State Law Library is the oldest law library in Alabama. Established in 1828 as the Library Society of the Bench and Bar of the Supreme Court, it was a private, nonprofit organization with the purpose of providing a library for the "exclusive use of the Bench and Bar of the Supreme Court of the State." In the late 1800s, when the law library became a state agency, it was Alabama's largest research library and continues that tradition today, serving the Supreme Court of Alabama, the Courts of Criminal and Civil Appeals, and all citizens of Alabama.

The Law Library has approximately 250,000 volumes in its collection but is also fully automated with over 65 computers for staff and library users, including a state-of-the-art computer lab. The Library is one of the oldest United States Government Depository libraries in the United States, having been designated a depository in 1884. Currently, the Law Library occupies approximately 38,000 square feet with space for approximately 80 researchers. It is a public law library, with hours of operation from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. The Law Library collection contains all of the reported decisions of the state and federal appellate courts in the United States, and the statutes of all 50 states and the District of Columbia, plus Acts of Congress, the United States Code, and the regulations of the various agencies of the United States Government. The legal periodical collection is one of the best in the State with more than 1,000 titles.

The Law Library's rare book collection is considered one of the finest in the southeastern United States. Its oldest book, Symbolaeographia, by William West, was published in 1605, seven years before the completion of the King James Version of the Bible. The collection includes over one-hundred 17th and 18th century law books and several thousand 19th century volumes. Unique to the collection are the briefs of the Alabama Supreme Court cases beginning in 1965, audio tapes of oral arguments of the Court beginning in 1979, and the papers of the Alabama Judicial College.

Beyond the role of the traditional library, the Supreme Court and State Law Library continues to pursue a strategic plan to remain on the forefront of technology. To this end, the Law Library provides public access to Westlaw computer-assisted legal research services, to all users so that they have access to the most sophisticated legal research engines available. In this same way, the Law Library provides Westlaw access to the entire judicial branch of government so that judges, circuit clerks, and other judicial branch employees will have access to legal information at their fingertips. The Law Library maintains an active website which includes the

Rules of the State Courts of Alabama and access to the Law Library's online catalog. Additionally, the Law Library has its own computerized public access catalog which includes the online catalogs of the Jefferson County Public Law Library, the Montgomery County Public Law Library, and the Elbert Parsons Public Law Library in Huntsville. All of which can be accessed from the Law Library website http://judicial.alabama.gov/library.cfm. The Law Library also has an active presence on Facebook.

The Law Library showcases the Heflin-Torbert Judicial Building, the appellate process, and the history of the courts through a public education program. This program includes guided tours of the Court, their courtrooms, museum exhibits, and the law library. Since 1994, over 215,000 visitors, mostly fourth-grade students, have participated in the judicial learning experience, understanding how the rule of law impacts our State and Nation.

The Junius Moore Riggs Portrait Collection is also a major part of the Law Library collection. In 1874, Marshal and Librarian Junius Moore Riggs began collecting portraits of governors of the State to hang in the halls of Capitol and in the Law Library. By the time of his resignation in 1934, Riggs had collected 44 portraits including governors, chief justices, and associate justices of the Court. The most notable portrait in the collection is that of Chief Justice George Goldthwaite, painted by Goldthwaite's grand-daughter, noted regional artist Ann Goldthwaite, which hangs in the Antebellum Gallery in the Supreme Court.

In October of 2016, the Law Library, the Supreme Court of Alabama, the Federalist Society for Law & Public Policy Studies, and the Blackstone Center for Law and Liberty at Thomas Goode Jones School of Law at Faulkner University sponsored the exhibit, Magna Carta, An Enduring Legacy, 1215 – 2015, created by the joint effort of the Library of Congress, the Law Library of Congress, and the American Bar Association. The exhibit was on display from October 11th through the 31st in the Rotunda of the Heflin-Torbert Judicial Building. During this period, approximately 1,000 visitors viewed the exhibit.

#### STATE LAW LIBRARIAN



**Timothy Alan Lewis**, a native of Talladega, Alabama, was appointed by the Supreme Court as State Law Librarian and Acting Marshal of the Supreme Court of Alabama on June 1, 1992. He served as Acting Marshal until 1993.

Mr. Lewis attended the public schools of Talladega, graduating from Talladega High School in 1974. He graduated from the University of Alabama, receiving his B.A. in English in 1979, his Master of Library Services in 1983, and his Juris Doctor in 1984. He was admitted to the Alabama State Bar Association in 1988. Tim served as Assistant Director of the Library from 1984 until his appointment as State Law Librarian and Acting Marshal.

Mr. Lewis taught as Adjunct Professor of Law at the Jones School of Law from 1988 to 1992, and is currently an Adjunct Professor at Auburn University at Montgomery in both the Department of Justice and Public Safety and the Management Department. He has taught numerous courses on legal research and computer-assisted legal research, and is the co-author of *Alabama Practice Materials: An Annotated Bibliography*, 82 Law Library Journal 703 (1990). He is also the author of several articles in the *Alabama Lawyer* and has written several book reviews.

Besides the Alabama State Bar, Mr. Lewis is a member of the Alabama Association of Law Libraries, the Special Libraries Association, the Southeastern Chapter of the American Association of Law Libraries, the Law Library Association of Alabama, the Alabama Library Association, and the Montgomery County Bar Association.

Mr. Lewis served as the Moderator of the Law Librarians Roundtable of the Alabama Library Association in 1989, President of the Law Library Association of Alabama from 1992 to 1993, the vice president for the Montgomery Judicial Chapter of the Alabama State Employees Association in 1995, the Coordinator of the Montgomery Area Library Resource Sharing Roundtable from 1995 to 1996, and served on the Board of Directors for the Center for Law and Civic Education at Cumberland School of Law, and the Board of Directors for the Law Magnet Program at Booker T. Washington Magnet School. He served as Local Arrangements Chair for the 2001 Alabama Library Association Convention held in Montgomery.

Currently, Mr. Lewis serves as the Treasurer of the Alabama Library Association, as co-chair of the Alabama State Bar Law Day Subcommittee, is a member of the Board of Directors of Camp Chandler (YMCA), a member of the Appellate Library Standards Committee (AALL), and represents special libraries on the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) Advisory Council.

Mr. Lewis is married to Christine Whitesell of Montgomery, and they have two children, Laura and Rebecca. He and his family attend the Episcopal Church of the Ascension in Montgomery where Mr. Lewis teaches 6th grade Sunday School, assists with the SOS Puppet Team, and is a member of the 1st Timothy Committee. He has been a member of the Montgomery Lions Club since 1987.

#### REPORTER OF DECISIONS



Mr. Blum is a member of the Association of Reporters of Judicial Decisions, an international professional association. He is married to Dr. Scout Blum, a professor of history at Troy University, and they have one child, Aidan.

**Sean Blum** was born in San Francisco, California, and was raised and educated primarily in Antioch, California, and Friendswood, Texas. Mr. Blum graduated from The University of Texas at Austin in 1993 with a bachelor of arts degree in English. He received his juris doctorate in 1996 from The University of Houston Law Center. Mr. Blum was admitted to the Texas State Bar in 1996 and to the Alabama State Bar in 2001.

Mr. Blum practiced law as a staff attorney and associate with the Williams Bailey Law Firm in Houston, Texas, upon graduation from law school in 1996 until 2000 and as an associate with the Beasley Allen Law Firm in Montgomery, Alabama, in 2001. He was appointed assistant reporter of decisions for the Alabama appellate courts in October 2001, and, in January 2021, he succeeded Bilee Cauley as the reporter of decisions for the Alabama appellate courts.

## MARSHAL OF THE APPELLATE COURTS



**Earl Marsh, Jr.,** was sworn in as Marshal of the Appellate Courts of Alabama by Chief Justice Tom Parker, on January 27, 2020, becoming the thirteenth Marshal of the appellate courts.

Marshal Marsh was born and raised in Greenville, Alabama. He was educated in the Butler County, Alabama schools and was recognized as an outstanding athlete in four sports throughout his high school years. Following his graduation from Greenville High School in 1984, he attended Alabama State University on an athletic scholarship. In 1985, he enlisted in the United States Army where he worked in field artillery and as a military police officer.

In 1989, Marshal Marsh began his law enforcement career with the Alabama Department of Corrections working as a corrections officer at Holman Prison in Atmore, Alabama. In 1994 he graduated from the Montgomery Police Academy, and soon thereafter joined the Lowndes County Sheriff's Office as a Deputy Sheriff. He was awarded Officer

of the Year in 2001 and has obtained numerous certifications, trainings, and recognitions throughout his military career and law enforcement career, including: distinguished graduate from the United States Army Military Police Special Reaction Team (SRT) course in Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri; graduate from the Criminal Justice Training Center for Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) in Selma, Alabama; Dignitary Protection certified through Alabama Law Enforcement Agency (ALEA); and anti-terrorism and counter-terrorism training.

In 2002, Marshal Marsh returned to the United States Army working as a military police officer on the Ronald Reagan Ballistic Missile Test Site, Marshall Islands, where he served as Instructor for Special Reaction Team for Police. He was transferred to Kuwait in 2004 where he served in various leadership roles, including Senior Sergeant of police operations and Military Police Sergeant Major. Marsh was also privileged to serve in Operation Enduring Iraqi Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, Operation New Dawn, and as special detail for President George W. Bush and Condoleezza Rice at Camp Arifijan, Kuwait during their visit in 2008. Marsh served the United States Army until 2014.

In January 2017, he joined the Alabama appellate courts as Deputy Marshal where he was promoted to Chief Deputy Marshal and served in that position until his appointment as Marshal.

Marshal Marsh and his wife, Jennifer, reside in Deatsville, Alabama. They are active members of their church, Big Union Christian Church in Lowndes County.

## JUDICIAL INQUIRY \_\_\_COMMISSION

tablished, in 1973, by Amendment 328 (the Judicial Article) to the Constitution of Alabama, the Judicial Inquiry Commission is convened permanently with authority to receive or initiate complaints and to conduct investigations concerning any Alabama judge's alleged violation of the Alabama Canons of Judicial Ethics, misconduct in office, failure to perform judicial duties, or inability to perform judicial duties because of a physical or mental disability. The Commission is further authorized to file and prosecute, in the Court of the Judiciary, complaints upon the Commission's finding a reasonable basis exists to charge an Alabama judge with Canon violations, misconduct, failure to perform duties, or inability to perform duties because of a physical or mental disability. In addition, the Commission may render, in its discretion, advisory opinions to judges upon request.

The Judicial Inquiry Commission consists of nine members: an intermediate appellate judge, two circuit judges, a district judge, three laypersons, and two attorneys. The three laypersons and the district judge are appointed by the Governor and are subject to Senate confirmation; the two circuit judges are appointed by the Circuit Judges' Association; and the two attorneys are appointed by the Commissioners of the Alabama State Bar. The Commissioners serve four-year terms.

The Judicial Inquiry Commission carried over. to fiscal year 2021, 17 complaints against Alabama judges, and it received 162 complaints during fiscal year 2021. Of those 179 complaints, 142 were dismissed, without investigation, on the Commission's findings each complaint did not present either a reasonable basis to charge, a claim within the Commission's jurisdiction, or an ethical violation, or a combination of any of those three. In addition, the Commission completed investigation of 20 complaints and subsequently dismissed those complaints. (Investigation of seventeen other complaints was carried over to fiscal year 2022.) The Commission met with three judges about complaints against those judges, and the Commission subsequently dismissed two of those complaints in 2021. The Commission filed charges against four judges in the Court of the Judiciary. In addition to the seventeen complaints under investigation, eight complaints pending the Commission's consideration were carried over to fiscal year 2022.

## COURT OF THE JUDICIARY

The Court of the Judiciary is a ninemember body that hears complaints filed by the Judicial Inquiry Commission. The Court is composed of one judge of an appellate court, other than the Supreme Court of Alabama, who shall be selected by the Supreme Court of Alabama and shall serve as Chief Judge of the Court of the Judiciary; two judges of the circuit court, who shall be selected by the Circuit Judges' Association; one district judge who shall be selected by the District Judges' Association; two members of the state bar, who shall be selected by the governing body of the Alabama State Bar; and three persons who are not lawyers who shall be appointed by the Governor. Members appointed by the Governor shall be subject to Senate confirmation before serving.

The Court has the authority to enter the following sanctions for a violation of a Canon of Judicial Ethics: removal from office, suspension with or without pay, censure, retire a judge who is physically or mentally unable to perform their judicial duties, or apply such other sanctions as may be prescribed by law.

Decisions of the Court of the Judiciary may be appealed to the Supreme Court of Alabama, which reviews the record of proceedings on the law and the facts. The Supreme Court of Alabama shall adopt rules governing the procedures of the Court of the Judiciary.

The clerk of the Court of Civil Appeals serves as secretary of the Court of the Judiciary.

There were four complaints filed with the Court by the Judicial Inquiry Commission during FY 2021.

## ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR OF COURTS



Rich resides in Montgomery, Alabama, with his wife, Susie, and is the father of two daughters, Whitney and Amelia. He has three grandchildren, William, Addie and Bay. The Hobsons worship at Lakeview Baptist Church where Rich leads the praise band and teaches the *Newly, Nearly, Barely Married* Sunday School Class and serves as a deacon. Hobbies include: running, reading, playing guitar and singing in the Christian rock band, *WoodScott*. A native of Enterprise, Alabama, Rich earned his A.A. from Enterprise State Junior College and his B.A., M.A. and Doctor of Public Administration from The University of Alabama.

Rich Hobson was appointed Administrative Director of Courts, for the third time, by Chief Justice Tom Parker in January 2019. Rich previously served in this position under Chief Justice Roy Moore from 2001-2003 and 2013-2016. During one of the interims, Rich served as executive director of the Foundation for Moral Law (2003 to 2013). Prior to 2001, he served in the Alabama Unified Judicial System in a variety of capacities including as a Court Referral Officer, State Manager of the Court Referral Officer Program, the Alabama Judicial College, Judicial Volunteer Program, Court Improvement Project and Courthouse Security from 1988 to 2001.

Rich is a trained mediator and a former adjunct professor in the Department of Criminal Justice at Faulkner University. Rich is the past Governor of the Alabama Society of Mayflower Descendants, State Chairman of the Alabama Child Evangelism Board, and served on the Prince Institute Advisory Board. He is also the past president of the Central Alabama Laubach Literacy Board, the Good Morning Montgomery Kiwanis Club, Montala Toastmasters Club, Emerald Mountain Christian School Parent/Teacher Fellowship, and is the former worship leader for Celebrate Recovery at Cloverdale Baptist Church in Montgomery, and served in the U.S. Air Force Reserves (1985-91).

The Chief Justice of the Alabama Supreme Court is the chief administrative officer of the State's court system and is authorized to appoint an Administrative Director of Courts (ADC) and other personnel to assist in the performance of administrative responsibilities. This constitutionally created entity overseeing Alabama's Unified Judiciary is called the Administrative Office of Courts (AOC).

The Alabama Unified Judicial System is a state-funded court system consisting of the Supreme Court and two intermediate courts of appeal, the Court of Criminal Appeals and the Court of Civil Appeals. The systems also includes the trial courts of general jurisdictions (the circuit courts) and the courts of limited jurisdiction (the district, probate, and municipal courts). Municipal courts receive training and technical assistance from the AOC although judges and court personnel are selected by and answerable to their city governments. Probate judges and their staff are county employees.

The AOC, under the direction of the Administrative Director of Courts, is charged with providing the centralized, state-level administrative support necessary to the operation of the State court system, which includes the development of improved procedures and systems to increase the operational capacity of the courts, the collection and dissemination of information necessary for the development of policy, and the efficient operation of the courts. Alabama was one of the first states in the nation to have a unified state court system with uniform procedures and centralized administrative services. The Unified Judicial System of Alabama (UJS) has been in existence since 1977.

The AOC carries out its responsibilities through a network of specialized divisions. This necessary link within the court system successfully implements plans addressing the training, educational, and developmental needs of officials and employees of the Unified Judicial System. These tasks are implemented in part by and through the Alabama Judicial College, along with the support of statewide technological expertise and implementation of the Information Technology Divisions.

The AOC also houses basic support departments such as Human Resources and Finance, but there exists more specialized departments such as the Family Court Division, the Legal Division, and the Public Information Office. The AOC is most specifically made up of talented individuals from many walks of life serving the needs of their fellow citizens.

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY DIVISION

The Information Technology (IT) Division provides the support necessary for the day-to-day business operations of the Unified Judicial System, both in the trial courts and the Administrative Office of Courts. The IT Division aids in the enhancement of administrative functions using technology and coordinates with state agencies regarding sharing of services and information. The IT Division makes available public information to the criminal justice community, social and juvenile services, and the public as a whole. Additionally, this division offers online services to all 67 counties at all court sites, juvenile offices, and pardons and paroles offices. Finally, the IT Division maintains current UJS applications as well as new developments and upgrades.

The IT Division, the largest area of operation within the AOC, is responsible for the development and maintenance of automation within the UJS. The sections in this area include: Applications Programming, Information Technology Support, Information Technology Helpdesk, Mainframe, and Networking.

#### **APPLICATIONS PROGRAMMING**

This section is responsible for the development and the maintenance of all automated systems supporting the information management needs of the UJS. This section designs, develops, tests, implements and maintains the mainframe and serverbased applications that comprise the Alabama Statewide Judicial Information System (SJIS).

Project management functions are provided to judicial system contractors and business partners. Daily, this section performs system analysis, develops product specifications, tests, approves and implements new systems, and serves as a mediator between user groups and contractors.

One of the premiere case management applications in the nation can be found in Alabama; MIDAS (Model Integrated Defendant Access System) was developed for use by Alabama Court Referral Officers in 2003. The application allows users the opportunity to manage offenders from one application; court records, criminal and driving histories and case management functionality are available in one location.

In 2005, MIDAS was rewritten with new functionality that allowed Drug Courts, District Attorneys, and Community Corrections Officers to utilize the application. In 2007, MIDAS was rewritten for the third time. Also, in 2007, Juvenile Probation Officers saw the impact MIDAS was making as a complete defendant case management tool and released their version of MIDAS, named JUPITIR (Juvenile Probation Intake Treatment Integrated Resource), in the summer of 2009.

In February 2010, a new in-house helpdesk trouble ticketing system was deployed. SHARK (Service Helpdesk Assistance Repair and Knowledge) provides an avenue for UJS users to report and track technical support issues by submitting a "ticket" via a website interface. SHARK allows user requests for assistance to be acted upon in a timelier manner than previous error reporting methods.

In 2012, the UJS Portal was created to provide a centralized website for court staff to get the latest news and updated forms and manuals.

In 2013, the Court Referral Education Program was added to the MIDAS application. This module is used to provide a link between the Court Referral Officers and the Court Referral Education Program. It allows instructors to manage their own bookkeeping and journals, provides class management, and informs a Court Referral Officer when defendants complete their classes.

In 2014, the eWorksheets application was rewritten with enhanced security and functionality, along with a significant number of upgrades to better serve the courts using the latest technology. This application is used to complete sentencing worksheets by District Attorneys and other court staff in all counties

In 2015, the eTranscripts application was rewritten to improve performance, compatibility and security issues. The eTranscripts application is a web-based tool designed to assist the circuit clerk offices and the Department of Corrections in creating and processing electronic transcripts. This application was rewritten from the ground-up utilizing the most current technology available.

In 2016, the Alacourt.gov website was redesigned with a more modern look and feel. It was also designed to be compatible with mobile-based devices for easier use.

Also, in 2016 all file transfers were migrated to a new centralized and secure process utilizing our MoveIT DMZ, WS\_FTP and MoveIT Central software developed by IPSwitch. It also allows users to securely transfer sensitive or large files between other users and organizations.

In 2017, the Judicial College Conferences website was completely rewritten to offer a more modern look and feel, and to provide support for mobile devices. The Conferences website is a webbased tool designed to allow Judicial College employees to create and post conference events online, via new administration screens. Users then login to the Conferences site to sign up for conferences and training events Statewide, and to view their Continuing Education Units/Credits.

Also, in 2017, websites were recreated for the following counties: Pike, Bessemer, Morgan, Macon, Talladega, Clay, Chilton, Washington, Marshall, Marion, Etowah, Escambia, Elmore, Baldwin, Autauga and Lee counties. These websites allow circuit clerk offices to assist the public and reduce the amount of phone calls received.

In 2018, county websites were created for Perry, Calhoun, Dallas, Blount, Monroe, Cherokee, and Jackson County circuit clerk offices.

In 2018, a website was also created for the Alabama WINGS (Working Interdisciplinary Network of Guardian Stakeholders) program. It delivers information, resources and tools throughout the legal system and to the general public, as a means of supporting decision-making and providing protective services to individuals.

In 2018 a calendaring system was created for the Heflin-Torbert Judicial Building to manage building-wide events between the Administrative Office of Courts and the Appellate Courts.

In 2019, websites were created for Tuscaloosa, Jefferson, Cullman, Lawrence, Montgomery, Dale, Geneva, Bibb, Barbour, Wilcox, Colbert and Pickens counties.

In 2019, the Sentencing Commission, E-Forms and UJS-Portal websites were redesigned and modernized. The Alabama Sentencing Commission works to establish and maintain an effective, fair, and efficient sentencing system for Alabama that enhances public safety, provides truth-insentencing, avoids unwarranted disparity, retains meaningful judicial discretion, recognizes the most efficient and effective use of correctional resources, and provides a meaningful array of sentencing options. The E-Forms website contains fillable forms used by court staff, attorneys and pro se litigants. The UJS Portal website was developed for judges. circuit clerks, court specialists, court referral officers, judicial assistants, juvenile probation officers, and specialty courts. These private-access pages provide the means for the dissemination and sharing of valuable information and resources, including documents, memoranda, manuals, training materials and videos.

In 2020, county courthouse websites were created for every county to inform the public of the latest COVID-19 orders and jury information. Most of these new websites contain basic contact information for the courthouse staff with plans to expand the information available to the public regarding topics such as absentee voting, forms, filing fees and additional division specific information.

In March 2020, all jury term dates were cancelled due to the pandemic. This necessitated notification of all summoned jurors of the cancellation,

and temporarily halted issuance of future juror summons.

In September, 2020 a few counties resumed submitting jury summons. Then, by November, 2020 most every county was back to a normal summons process. Due to the backlog of court cases that needed to be heard, a process was put in place for some counties to summons potential jurors on the same day at different times. Clerks' offices could summons more jurors and handle a larger caseload in the courtrooms each day.

In December 2020 jurors were reloaded from the Master Driver's License file that we receive from ALEA. This was for the list of counties that select to have their jurors pull from Driver's License rather than the Secretary of State (SOS) Voting list. The SOS Voting list was reloaded in February 2021.

In 2021 significant enhancements we made to UJIS accounting systems; criminal, traffic, and civil case management systems; as well as the jury management system.

The Applications Staff is currently working on numerous projects that are scheduled for deployment during the next 12 months. These projects include the following:

- Providing project management functions as well as technical and functional support to users and contractors involved with the UJIS Mainframe Migration Project. As of the end of 2021, a new web based UJIS Purchasing System was ready to begin beta testing. This application will replace a mainframe purchasing system and if the first step in the UJIS Mainframe Migration Project.
- Adding additional data elements, files, applications and other related enhancements to the UJIS in support of municipal court processing.
- Modernization of the CASPER Application.
   The CASPER application is a web-based tool designed to assign and manage jurors in a court room. It has been in pilot phase for only a few counties but will require a redesign of the interface in order to work in the latest browsers.
- County and Circuit Website Maintenance.
   Maintenance of approximately 100 websites for

Circuit Clerks, Judges and other judicial entities. The primary users of these sites can update their site's content as required, but AOC continues to provide most of the updates as necessary.

- Modernization of the JUPITIR Application. The JUPITIR application is a web-based tool is a case management tool for Juvenile Probation Officers within the state of Alabama. This application will be rewritten from the ground-up utilizing the most current technology available to provide a more streamlined and fault tolerant system for processing juveniles.
- Personnel Action Project. The HR Desktop application is a web-based tool designed to manage leave requests and employee performance evaluations. The Personnel Action module will be added to this application to allow for electronic data entry and automation of the personnel action process to streamline the submission of forms from the field to the Human Resources Division.
- Application Maintenance Project. Ongoing project to ensure that modifications and enhancements are made to existing applications to improve security and optimize performance.
- Court Cost Changes and Legislative Updates. Each year the Alabama Legislature enacts legislation that requires changes to the UJIS. These types of changes primarily facilitate updates to various fee schedules in-force in specific jurisdictions and at times requires changes to fee schedules on a statewide basis. Other common programming actions required by specific legislation includes: Charge code additions and/or deletions; inter-agency data exchange requirement updates; and ad hoc management reporting functions.

#### MAINFRAME

The Mainframe section of the Administrative Office of Courts is responsible for the availability for the Statewide Judicial Information System (SJIS) which handles an average of 1.5 million transactions per day. Among these responsibilities are making sure the online aspects of our system

are available and operating at optimum performance, providing assistance to users concerning report output, maintaining Mainframe equipment at user sites, and handling large volumes of mailed output.

The Mainframe system is constantly monitored to make sure there are no problems that could affect the SJIS users and others that require information from SJIS. The Mainframe section is responsible for the security of SJIS data and provides the data integrity and timely backups of all data on a daily basis. The Mainframe section also ensures that all Mainframe software is maintained and configured properly as well as providing technical support to other sections of the AOC.

Our IBM Z12 model has 8 GB FICON channels which provides us with maximum speed for our data transfers between disks and tapes. It also provides the amount of memory in the Z12 that results in much faster processing times. The Z12 uses the latest IBM internal processor instructions and that has improved system performance as well for all SJIS Applications.

We have continued to work on the following projects:

- <u>USPS Postal Requirements Up to Date</u>: These requirements change almost weekly. This allows us to continue to get the lowest discounts on the millions of mailers we produce on the mainframe.
- Ensure Daily Operations: Operation of the Mainframe to be stable and constant
- Evaluating All Third-Party Software: This helps ensure the System performs to fullest and serves our customers. This software must have latest code level and product keys for our mainframe to perform at its peak.
- Training new Staff in the Systems Operations Division.

#### PRINTSHOP

The AOC Print shop is responsible for producing envelopes for all the UJS officials as well as multipart forms and other products as requested. As of the end of 2021 we have printed over 13 million

envelopes since installing the new envelope printer in 2017. We now have much faster order turn around and service to the courts. The reduced cost of supplies for the printer has enabled us to save money while providing much better service. Our equipment provides us better technology as well as a reduction in per-copy costs.

#### NETWORKING/IT HELPDESK

Information Technology (IT) Infrastructure Management is responsible for the day-to-day operations of the Alabama Unified Judicial System's network and servers, providing services to over 3,000 users spread over 100 locations utilizing server and networking resources located at the Alabama Judicial Building Data Center. Helpdesk personnel receive 1,000 calls for assistance each month.

#### SJIS HELP DESK

The Unified Judicial Information System (UJIS) Helpdesk provides technical assistance, training, and problem resolution to users of the UJIS. Noteworthy accomplishments this reporting period include:

- Responded to an average of over 5,500 phone calls per month; 4,000 emails per month; and 450 team's messages per month.
- Submitted and monitored an average of 165 trouble tickets per month.
- Administered control over the UJIS access system.
- Maintained judge master records, clerk master records, enforcement system profiles and fee sys-

tem profiles.

- Assisted users with monthly accounting system closeouts and day-to-day bookkeeping issues.
- Provided circuit clerks with on-site financial and trial court procedural assistance.
- Assisted users regarding Alacourt Plus with setting up and testing cases for updating their applications.
- Provided assistance while setting up new municipal court users.
- Assisted users with the Online Juror Questionnaire process.
- Assisted users with Casper questions.
- Assisted users with updates pertaining to new Acts passed by legislation.

#### Information Technology (IT) Support

The Information Technology (IT) Support section provides training and support of technology related projects. Typical project management duties include staffing a telephone support desk and ticket management system, application training, video conferencing, preparing narrative reports, preparing manuals, creating online tutorials, testing of applications, and processing requirements for application development. IT Support serves as the liaison between the users and the technical staff.

Goals for 2022 include: continued development, implementation, and training of the Trial Court Exhibits Module, the Online Traffic Resolution (OTR) System, the Online Dispute Resolution (ODR) System in the Small Claims division, statewide Criminal E-Filing. Electronic Certified Mail Process with UPS and USPS, AlacourtPlus eCertify (Certified Court Documents) for Circuit Clerks, Phase II of the Alacourt.com for Attorneys of Record when the case is Public but Documents are Confidential, Updating the Certificate of Divorce per the changes made by AL Dept. of Public Health (ALDPH), the Electronic Transfer of Case File and Images between Counties, the AlaFile Publication option, the Continued Statewide Deployment of eWarrants (Warrant Management System) including interfacing with ALEA's eCrime software, and updating the eAppellate application to improve functionality and performance.

Recent accomplishments include: AlaPay (Partial Payments), AlacourtPlus AlaVault 'Send Parties' Scan Feature, Batch Traffic Orders (Nol Pross, Dismissals, and Continuances), Added Court Reporter to AlaFile Notice of Appeal, and AlacourtPlus Virtual Hearing to include Batch Cases (enhancement).

IT Support has completed 1,017 SHARK tickets and assisted with 12,593 inbound calls this year as well as 12,368 outbound calls totaling 24,961 calls handled in FY 2021.

#### PC HELP DESK

The PC Helpdesk is responsible for providing information technology (IT) support to all Alabama Judicial system personnel. This IT support includes but is not limited to PCs, laptops, printers, scanners, and other technology devices.

In 2021, the PC Helpdesk processed approximately 2,000 Service Helpdesk, Assistance, Report, and Knowledge (SHARK) tickets and received over 20,000 telephone calls.

Users continue to experience and enjoy the benefits of Microsoft Office 365 applications (Word, Excel, Outlook, SharePoint, Teams, and OneDrive) from anywhere with internet connectivity—using any device—Windows, Mac, Android and other mobile devices

#### TRAFFIC SERVICE CENTER / TRAFFIC CALL CENTER

The Income Tax Intercept Program interacts with the public, as well as the trial courts, in providing information that streamlines the collection of court ordered monies and assists circuit clerk's offices by diverting information inquiries to a central location. In fiscal year 2021, \$2,404,805.20 was recovered in delinquent court ordered monies through this section.

The SJIS Helpdesk and Accounting/Bookkeeping Program provide technical assistance with the processes of the State Judicial Information System (SJIS) through training, manuals, inquiries, and problem resolution.

The Traffic Call Center handled 203,104 cases and collected \$38,252,750.32 in court fines and fees in fiscal year 2021.

### ALABAMA JUDICIAL COLLEGE

The Alabama Judicial College, a section of the Education and Planning Division of the Administrative Office of Courts, is charged with the implementation of a comprehensive plan that addresses the educational, developmental, and training needs of members of the Unified Judicial System. Continuing education and training programs administered by the Alabama Judicial College recognize the career development needs of court officials and employees.

During 2021, the College developed and coordinated over sixty-meetings which include onsite and off-site conferences, regional trainings, and seminars for officials and employees of the circuit, district, and municipal courts. Since its inception, the College has followed a comprehensive model of adult learning theory which emphasizes continuing education of all court officials and staff to enhance the proper administration of justice.

During Fiscal Year 2021, the Alabama Judicial College witnessed an increase in trainings. This happened even as the COVID-19 pandemic was up and down throughout the state. All core groups with the Judiciary increased in attendance. In two groups there was a waiting list to attend.

The Judicial College has implemented their final phase with the electronic registrations and handouts portal. There are two groups remaining that have not converted to the digital registration portal.

#### **FAMILY COURT DIVISION**

The Family Court Division provides services in eight different, but related, areas for the Alabama judicial system. Those areas include:

- Unified Family Courts
- Juvenile Probation Services
- Access and Visitation Grant Program
- Court Improvement Program Grants

- Judicial Volunteer Program
- Child Support/Referees
- Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) Grant
- Accountability Courts

The goal of this division is to provide a wide array of services so that the juvenile and family courts can be more efficient and effective for families and children in Alabama.

#### Unified Family Court

The concept of a unified family court is to place cases dealing with juvenile and family law in one court in order to serve the families more effectively and efficiently. Family Courts or family court divisions have been established, either by statute or local act, in the following counties:

#### JUVENILE PROBATION SERVICES

The Family Court Division manages the State Juvenile Probation Officer Program, which was created in 2000 in response to the mandate of the Alabama Legislature in § 12-5A-1, *Ala. Code* 1975, that a comprehensive system of juvenile probation services be developed, implemented, and administered by the Administrative Office of Courts.

Juvenile probation officers are an integral part of the juvenile justice system. Juvenile probation officers perform a variety of services which are essential to the proper operation of the juvenile courts including working primarily with youths who are alleged to be delinquent or in need of supervision.

The functions of the Family Court Division, with respect to juvenile probation officers, include the establishment of statewide guidelines, certification, and training standards. Currently, there are 270 juvenile probation officers statewide. Of those, 169 are employed by the Unified Judicial System, along with 15 UJS juvenile support personnel. These personnel serve 62 of Alabama's 67 counties. The program provides juvenile probation salary subsidies to the five counties in which juvenile probation officers are county employees.

#### Access and Visitation Grant Program

The Administrative Office of Courts, through the Family Court Division and the Alabama Center for Dispute Resolution, administer the federallyfunded Access and Visitation Grant Program, the goal of which is to develop programs and services to improve noncustodial parents' access to and visitation with their children. The grant has an Advisory Committee, chaired by the Honorable Adrian Johnson, District Judge of Lowndes County. Funds from the grant are primarily used to fund seven subgrantee programs that provide one or more of the following services: mediation of visitation issues; parenting education programs; development of parenting plans; counseling; neutral drop-off/ pick-up; supervised visitation; and visitation enforcement.

#### COURT IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (CIP) GRANTS

#### BASIC CIP GRANT

The Basic CIP grant is a federally-funded program that has been administered by the AOC since FY 1995. The goal of the grant is to streamline juvenile court procedures and processes so that children adjudicated dependent may be placed in safe, permanent homes as quickly as possible. The primary activities of the Grant include the following:

- Guardian ad Litem (GAL) Certification and Recertification Training (Note: As of 9/30/2021, 1,174 attorneys were on the certified GAL appointment list)
- Parents' Attorney Training
- Probate/Juvenile Judge Subcommittee
- Collaborative Activities with the Alabama Department of Human Resources (DHR)
- Assessment of the Alabama Juvenile and Family Courts

#### CIP Training Grant

Beginning in September 2006, the AOC, through the Family Court Division, began administering a grant from the federal government primarily to be utilized for training initiatives. This grant has an advisory committee, chaired by Associate Justice Kelli Wise. The primary objectives of this grant include training new juvenile and family court judges, administrative support assistants, and other juvenile court officials and employees on various topics when needed.

#### CIP Data Collection and Analysis Grant

Beginning in September 2006, the AOC, through the Family Court Division, began administering another grant from the federal government primarily to be utilized for data collection and analysis to help ensure that foster children's needs for safety, permanency, and well-being are met in a timely and complete manner. Primary activities include the following:

- Continual updating and revising current data collection methods
- Developing cross-system collaboration between existing state systems
- Developing and implementing enhancements to the electronic information systems

#### THE JUDICIAL VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

By order of the Supreme Court of Alabama dated January 19, 2000, effective March 1, 2000, Rule 42, Alabama Rules of Judicial Administration, was adopted allowing the use of a Judicial Volunteer

Program in those circuit or district courts choosing to do so.

Carefully screened, interviewed, and trained citizen-volunteers are utilized in appropriate programs to assist in the court process. There are seven judicial volunteer programs throughout Alabama. Most programs have a judicial volunteer program coordinator overseeing these programs.

One aspect of the Judicial Volunteer Program is the Juvenile Conference Committee. Juvenile Conference Committees are authorized pursuant to Rule 15.1, Alabama Rules of Juvenile Procedure. Through the use of Juvenile Conference Committees, a large percentage of petitions filed in juvenile court can be diverted and disposed of expeditiously. The Juvenile Court can then devote more time to dealing with the serious and repeat juvenile offenders.

Another aspect of the Judicial Volunteer Program is district court mediation in which trained volunteers are used as mediators in specific cases in district court, mostly small claims.

#### CHILD SUPPORT/REFEREES

The Alabama Central Disbursement Division (ACDD) of AOC was established as a result of a federal law known as the Welfare Reform Act of 1996. This law required that a single location be established in each state where employers could send wages withheld for child support, to be processed. In FY 2021, ACDD disbursed 460,853 payments, totaling over \$134,648,758 dollars; averaging 38,404 payments of just over \$11.2 million dollars, monthly.

Non-Title IV-D payments (or wages withheld but not processed through the Alabama Department of Human Resources) are receipted at a central location and disbursed by the ACDD. Payments are receipted at the Child Support Payment Center and disbursed to the custodial parent the next business day. Paper checks are no longer issued. Payments are sent to the recipient's checking account, savings account, or personal debit card. The result is a much safer and quicker process than paper checks, which benefits the child and the public. Recipients are notified via email when a payment is released.

With recent changes to the central website all payments received are posted by 7:00 am (CST) the next day. This enhancement has reduced the number of incoming calls to the ACDD and allows parents to find out about their support payments, without having to call. Parents also have the ability to view and print out their own payment histories from the website, as needed. Parents are encouraged to call the ACDD or send an email, if they have questions. The ACDD Call Center is open Monday through Friday, from 7:00 am until 5:00 pm (CST).

During FY 2021, there were 8 full-time and 19 part-time referees who served 23 counties. 22 of these referees were funded by the Alabama Department of Human Resources with federal child support monies.

#### VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN ACT (VAWA) GRANT

This Grant is for the purpose of educating judicial officials and employees and other stakeholders on the causes and consequences of domestic violence, the actual content of the domestic violence and protection from abuse laws, and national and other state best practices in this area. This project is also for the purposes of presenting court officials with enhanced skills in domestic violence as well as to develop or expand existing automated systems to link police, prosecutors, and courts for the purpose of tracking arrests, protection orders, and convictions for violent crimes against women.

#### **ACCOUNTABILITY COURTS**

#### **DRUG COURTS**

Alabama currently faces severe issues with prison overcrowding. Model Drug Courts are one way of dealing with this problem. Drug Courts represent the coordinated efforts of the judiciary, prosecution, defense, probation, law enforcement, mental health, social services, and the treatment community to actively and forcefully intervene and break the cycle of substance abuse, addiction, and crime.

Currently, there are 59 Adult Drug Courts, in Alabama's 67 counties. On average, there are 3,300 active adult Drug Court participants each month in Alabama. Drug Courts are utilized as an

alternative sentencing method to: (1) assist nonviolent offenders who have committed offenses while under the influence of alcohol or drugs to be given the opportunity to turn their lives around, and (2) make the public safer while reducing the demand for prison space. Alabama also features several other Problem-Solving Courts (specialized courts modeled after Drug Courts focused on addressing other underlying issues of chronic criminal behaviors) including 12 Family Drug Courts with an average of 300 active participants, 9 Juvenile Drug Courts with an average of 160 active participants, 28 (5 combined with Drug Courts) Veterans Treatment Courts with an average of 230 active participants, and 14 Mental Health Courts with an average of 210 active participants.

## COURT REFERRAL OFFICER AND EDUCATION PROGRAMS

The Court Referral Officer (CRO) Program began in 1985 as a pilot program to assist judges in early identification and placement of DUI offenders as one method of reducing the devastating problem of drunk driving. Since the implementation of the Mandatory Treatment Act of 1990, Court Referral Officers have provided services to defendants in a broader spectrum of cases related to alcohol and drug use or abuse. The CRO and Court Referral Education Programs are Alabama's legacy programs when dealing with alcohol and drug offenses.

CROs are a key ingredient in Alabama's comprehensive approach to the management of case involving substance abuse or other related issues. Utilizing the Operational Screening Criteria, CROs provide a thorough evaluation and make the appropriate recommendations for each defendant. This important information will ensure placement of each defendant in the most appropriate program to supplement traditional judicial sanctions.

Local Court Referral Programs were developed to provide defendants in alcohol and drug abuse-related offenses with education and treatment referral services, and to act as "resource brokers" within local communities. These programs were designed to be used in conjunction with court orders, not as a replacement for judicial sanctions.

In fiscal year 2021, 16,331 defendants were evaluated and referred for education or treatment. Of these defendants, 2,070 were placed in the Level I education programs, 8,836 were placed in the Level III education programs, and 5,894 were referred to Level III outpatient or inpatient programs. There were 86,972 monitoring sessions conducted in FY 2021

The AOC certifies and contracts with 25 agencies to provide alcohol and drug education programs and more than 100 CROs to evaluate defendants and provide monitoring sessions throughout the State. The Court Referral Program receives no General Fund monies.

Many Community Corrections and Drug Court programs across Alabama include Court Referral Officers. This important meshing of these services has met with broad success.

#### **FINANCE DIVISION**

The Finance Division of the Administrative Office of Courts, under the direction of the UJS Finance Director, is charged with the professional management of all funding resources allocated to the AOC and the trial courts of the State of Alabama. Support services are provided in the areas of budget preparation, accounting, purchasing, executive contract reviews, state agency contracts, county expense claims, property inventory, records management, and UJS expenditure management.

The Finance Director serves as a liaison with the appellate courts regarding fiscal matters and responds to questions pertaining to judicial finances from the Alabama legislative and executive branches of government. The total expenditures of the trial courts and the Administrative Office of Courts for fiscal year 2021 was \$187,998,426.

Grants awarded to the Administrative Office of Courts and trust accounts are administered by the grants accountant and the various project managers, in accordance with the appropriate policies and procedures. Expenditure vouchers are processed by accounting staff in accordance with procedures ad-

ministered by the State Comptroller, as well as the monthly balancing of all revenues and expenditures. The UJS Finance Division participates in financial and property audits as scheduled and coordinated with the State Examiner of Public Accounts and Office of the State Auditor to ensure compliance with all State government accountability procedures.

Additionally, the responsibilities of the UJS Finance Division include juror payments. Approximately 32,124 jurors served the Circuit Courts of Alabama from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. Juror payments totaled \$794,996 in FY 2021.

The Finance Division has the responsibility of overseeing property management within the Alabama circuit and district courts and the AOC for state-owned commodities. The Unified Judicial System currently has approximately 10,235 active State property assets with a value of \$500 or more. These commodities are currently included on the statewide UJS inventory with an acquisition value in excess of \$13,187,119 dollars.

#### **HUMAN RESOURCES DIVISION**

The Human Resources Division of the Administrative Office of Courts provides a full range of human resources services to the Judicial Branch of Government and the general public. Direct support is provided to approximately 1,876 Unified Judicial System officials and employees. These officials and employees include 132 appellate judges and employees (to include 2 Alabama Sentencing Commission Employees), 1,664 trial court officials and employees (appx. 218 are county funded employees), and 80 Administrative Office of Courts staff (including 1 temporary employee).

#### PERSONNEL OPERATIONS

The Personnel Operations Section of this Division processes all personnel actions. In FY 2021, more than 2,772 separate actions were processed manually, including appointments, separations, leaves without pay, three and six-month probationary paperwork, and longevity bonuses, preparing and distributing salary adjustment invoices, as well as other miscellaneous actions such as tax, address, and name changes. The Operations Section maintains all employee personnel records and position control for the

judicial branch of government, using an automated information system and periodic reports. This section also audits all Unified Judicial System payrolls and certifies state service for the annual longevity bonus and conducts background checks and E-verify for applicants for the pre-employment screening process.

#### PAYROLL OPERATIONS

The Payroll Section of the Human Resources Division provides or processes services such as: daily data entry, timesheets, one-time pay, supplemental pay, circuit clerks' restitution, reimbursement checks, Title IV-D payments, duplicate/cancelled warrants, county supplement, FICA cut offs, W-2 and eMap service requests through the year, JPO fund updates, insurance, reimbursement for separated/terminated/retired employees, longevity bonuses, deferred compensation (e.g., Great-West, RSA-1, United Way) funding source/organization code changes, unemployment compensation, insurance billing, direct deposits, employment verifications, retirement contributions, and miscellaneous deductions.

#### **FRINGE BENEFITS**

The Human Resources Division is responsible for monitoring a leave program (Human Resources Desktop) for approximately 1,397 leave-earning UJS employees. Because leave represents a potential debt of the UJS, the Human Resources Division audits leave accounts annually.

#### TESTING AND RECRUITMENT

For FY 2021, approximately 330 applicants took the written court specialist examinations that were given in the State of Alabama. In addition to maintaining the open and promotional court specialist registers, the division issued numerous special job announcements for positions at the AOC, the trial courts, the appellate courts, and the State Law Library. Approximately 425 total applications were received from these announcements.

#### **EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY**

There were 467 minorities employed in the UJS in FY 2021. This included 70 elected officials. Minorities comprised 27.20 percent of the total Unified Judicial System work force. The Human Resources Director is also the EEOC Officer for the UJS.


#### **LEGAL DIVISION**

The Legal Division assists the Chief Justice, the Administrative Director of Courts, Alabama's circuit and district judges, circuit clerks and AOC's division directors in resolving legal issues that arise in the performance of their respective duties, and in the daily operation and administration of the United Judicial System. The Division provides court officials and court staff with updates on changes to statutory and case law, rules of court and court procedural manuals.

Legal Division staff attorneys routinely serve as Judicial College faculty members, providing needed instruction at periodic training sessions and conferences. Upon request, staff attorneys conduct legal research and discuss legal issues with judges and other court officials.

In addition, the legislative function is staffed by the Legal Division to provide a liaison between court and legislative officials on court-related matters.

## JUDICIAL CIRCUITS OF ALABAMA



#### **AUTAUGA COUNTY**

The Autauga County Courthouse was built in 1906, replacing the 1870 Italianate courthouse still standing today in downtown Prattville. The current courthouse was built in the modified Richardsonian Romanesque style. The courthouse was remodeled and an addition was built in 1962.



There were 1,073 cases filed in Autauga Circuit Court in fiscal year 2021. Of those, 37% were criminal cases, 24% were civil cases, and 39% were domestic or juvenile cases. The Circuit Court disposed of 1,159 cases during the fiscal year.

During fiscal year 2021 8,654 cases were filed in Autauga District Court. Of those, 10% were criminal cases, 67% were traffic cases, 11.0% were small claims cases, 3% were other civil cases, 5% were juvenile cases, and 4% were child support cases. The District Court disposed of 8,896 cases during the fiscal year.

#### **BALDWIN COUNTY**



The Baldwin County Courthouse was designed in the Richardsonian Romanesque style by noted architect Frank Lockwood and built in 1901 after an election to move the courthouse from Daphne to Bay Minette. The courthouse stood vacant until 1905 when Bay Minette citizens physically removed all county records from the Daphne courthouse during the darkness of night in one of the most heated controversies of courthouse removal in Alabama history. The courthouse was remodeled and expanded in 1955. It was altered and remodeled again in 1988.

There were 10,884 cases filed in Baldwin Circuit Court in fiscal year 2021. Of those, 49% were criminal cases, 13% percent were civil cases, 20% were domestic cases, 13% were juvenile cases, and 5% were child support cases. The Circuit Court disposed of 10,392 cases during the fiscal year.

During fiscal year 2021 27,811 cases were filed in Baldwin District Court. Of those, 32% were criminal cases, 52% were traffic cases, 11% were small claims, and 5% percent were other civil cases. The District Court disposed of 30,600 cases during the fiscal year.



#### **BARBOUR COUNTY**

Barbour County has two courthouses — one in Clayton (pictured) and one in Eufaula. The courthouse in Clayton was constructed in 1961 for \$414,030 and designed by Carl Herbert Lancaster, Jr., of Montgomery. It replaced an antebellum Greek revival courthouse.

The Eufaula courthouse was constructed in 1924 as a courthouse and city hall. It was renovated and expanded in 1986 and is now used exclusively as a courthouse.



There were 537 cases filed in Barbour Circuit Court in fiscal year 2021. Of those, 43% were criminal cases, 22% were civil cases, and 34% percent were domestic cases. The Circuit Court disposed of 339 cases during the fiscal year.

During fiscal year 2021 5,524 cases were filed in Barbour District Court. Of those, 17% percent were criminal cases, 57% percent were traffic cases, 14% percent were small claims, 2% were other civil cases, 2% were juvenile cases, and 7% were child support cases. The District Court disposed of 6,103 cases during the fiscal year.



# **WILCOX COUNTY**

The Wilcox County Courthouse was constructed in 1858. Designed by Alexander Bragg, brother of Confederate General Braxton Bragg, the Greek revival courthouse was built to resemble the courthouse designed by Robert Mills in Camden, South Carolina. Two additions were added to the courthouse in 1963. In 1978, a three-story courthouse annex was constructed one block from the courthouse, and all court operations were moved to the annex.



There were 132 cases filed in Wilcox Circuit Court in fiscal year 2021. Of those, 14% were criminal cases, 48% were civil cases, and 38% were domestic cases. The Circuit Court disposed of 124 cases during the fiscal year.

During fiscal year 2021 1,790 cases were filed in Wilcox District Court. Of those, 21% were criminal cases, 58% were traffic cases, 10% were small claims, 2% were other civil cases, 3% were juvenile cases, and 7% were child support cases. The District Court disposed of 1,603 cases during the fiscal year.
